Why do technicians churn?



Strike a balance with your techs.

ServiceTitan data shows that techs who are overbooked or underbooked are more likely to churn.



Weekdays are preferred.

Similarly, technicians with more than 15% of their jobs falling on weekend days are 24% more likely to churn*.



Manage drive time. Keep it close!

Techs who drive 50 minutes or more for about a quarter of their time are more likely to churn*.

Other strategies to consider ...

- Pay competitively: Of those polled in ServiceTitan's <u>Tech</u>
 <u>Shortage Survey</u>, higher wages was quoted as a top reason to leave a job.
- ▶ Offer training: In the same survey 17% of departing techs said the reason they left was for better training opportunities.
